

## Report

To offer you a more in-depth view of the work, the 2009 services included our two pastorates, James Chapel Community Holiness and Fairview Christian Holiness, as well as the evangelistic effort. The pastorates included our weekly services, 13 nursing home visitations, 3 revivals, 2 weddings, 2 funerals, a Homecoming and a Vacation Bible School. The evangelistic schedule included 21 revivals, 20 special evangelistic services, 8 prison services and 6 camp meetings, in which we were permitted to provide all or part of the preaching, teaching, and/or singing. There were also more than a dozen business meetings, several days spent working on Home Mission projects, and various home and hospital visitations, as well. All of this resulted in more than 25,000 miles traveled.

"What is Holiness?"

Part One

There is certainly no lack of material on the subject of holiness, nor number of accredited authors that one could glean from, yet there seems to be much disagreement on this very central Christian doctrine.

In an attempt to generally explain this glorious truth, with the greatest amount of simplicity, I would like to consider only two references, one sacred and the other secular - the Bible and Webster's Dictionary. I have chosen these two because one is the authority of the Christian Faith and the other is an authority on the English language. Let's begin with the greater of the two, the Bible.

As we endeavor to summarize a biblical view of the subject we must first understand that holiness begins with God. The book
